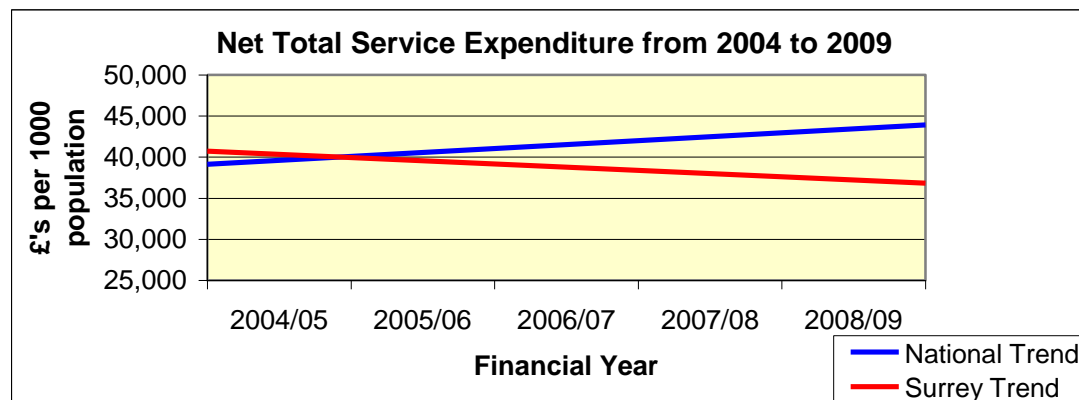


The Graph below shows compares the trend for the Net Total Service Expenditure between Surrey and the National average of all\* FA's between 2004 & 2008. The latest Surrey County Council imposed funding cuts will ensure this funding gap widens even further.



The table below shows just how little has been invested in Surrey Fire and Rescue Service compared to other FA's over the same time period. If Surrey had increased it's funding to SF&RS by the average (13%); in 2008 Surrey would have been spending £45,156 per 1000 pop. rather than £37,853.
